ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Special Education Manual Updates

Bryce Day, Special Education Director presented a summary of updates to the Granite Special Education Policies and Procedures Manual. The Utah State Board of Education updated the Special Education Policies and Procedures Manual in August. Each school district is required to align their manual with the state manual by October 18, 2021. Granite's manual is based on a template provided by USBE. The state has reviewed and given feedback on our revisions. Mr. Day then listed eight areas of substantive changes to the manual. The updated Special Education Policies & Procedures Manual will be a consent item on the agenda. (Exhibit 2208)

Board members asked questions regarding record keeping and other requirements specific to Special Education. The board is aware of the additional work required of teachers to comply with IDEA requirements. They expressed concern about burnout among special education teachers.

Staffing Report

Patrick Flanagan, Human Resources Director, gave the annual teacher staffing report for the 2021-2022 school year. We have filled 156 elementary and preschool teaching openings and 128 contract secondary teaching openings. Of the 284 teachers hired, 187 are new to the profession and 97 come to us with experience. The education level of new hires is 197 with Bachelor's, 73 with Masters, 2 with Doctorate Degrees. We have 16 interns working on Bachelor's Degrees. Recruiting efforts are ongoing all year. Often applicants learn of Granite District by word of mouth form our employees. Collective efforts made by the Board of Education and GEA have a positive influence on our ability to recruit teachers. The 6% COLA, 3% bonus, our health clinic, and teacher professional development days help us to attract highly qualified teachers. (Exhibit 2211)
