Boundary Study Update

THE PROCESS

January - gather information and feedback for possible studies

February to June - meet with school councils, consider potential impacts and explore multiple solutions

July to September - Follow up mtg with Community Councils and PAC to consider with the board whether to proceed to the next step of the study process, an open house.

October/November - Hold an open house for more community feedback

November/December - Potential decision on the study

At the June Board meeting the *Bennion Jr feeder pattern* study was *continued*

Bennion Jr. Feeder Pattern

All of Bennion Elementary and all of Westbrook Elementary feed into Bennion Jr. high.

From there, 50% of the Bennion Elementary students and 100% of the Westbrook Elementary students feed into Cottonwood High School.

The request was made by a community member to consider making the Bennion Junior High boundary feed ONLY into Taylorsville High, thereby making it a clean feeder.

If Bennion Jr. Were to Feed Entirely Into Taylorsville...

- Taylorsville would realize a net gain of approximately 190 students over a 3-4 year period.
- Cottonwood would realize a corresponding net loss of 190 students over a 3-4 year period.

Taylorsville Community Council

In favor of continuing the study into the next phase - holding an open house

Cottonwood Community Council

While the Cottonwood Community Council is understandably not eager to lose students they:

- 1) Understand the desires of the Taylorsville community
 - 2) Recognize the potential impact to Cottonwood

and

3) Are not opposing the idea

The Population Analysis Committee made a recommendation that this study be allowed to continue to the open house phase
