Dear Dr. Bates:

The purchasing department has received two requisitions signed by Mr. Richard Anthony and Mr. Mike Fraser for programming services for English as a Second Language (ESL) for refugees.

The district has signed an interagency agreement with the State of Utah Department of Workforce Services to act as the fiscal agent for grant funds from the Refugee Social Services Grant. This agreement has been created with the purpose to continue existing English as a Second Language (ESL) programs and/or develop additional ESL programs that 1) focus on the needs of refugees, 2) increase refugee participation, and 3) provide instruction in the acquisition of English oral and literate language skills.

The Asian Association of Utah and the English Skills Learning Center are the named contractors in the grant who will perform services as required in the agreement.

This letter requests permission from the Board of Education to issue purchase orders for programming services in the amount of \$50,500.00 to the Asian Association of Utah and \$88,500.00 to the English Skills Learning Center. Funds for this contract will come from the awarded Refugee Social Services Grant.

The Purchasing Department has received a requisition requesting the purchase of architectural and engineering services for the addition of carbon monoxide detection and monitoring in 13 elementary schools and 7 junior high schools. This requisition has been signed by Mr. Jim Day and Mr. Don Adams.

In 2014 legislation was passed that required the installation of carbon monoxide systems in all public schools within the state. The district worked with the state and conducted a pilot program last year consisting of five schools. At that time a request for statements of qualifications (SOQ) was issued by the Purchasing Department seeking qualified architectural firms' proposals to perform the services for the pilot year and for four subsequent years to allow for phasing of the work due to budgetary restraints. The awarded architect was GSBS Architects.

The Purchasing Department has received a request for the purchase of construction services for the Cottonwood High School Solar Panel Project. This project is being funded by a grant from Rocky Mountain Power through their Blue Sky program. This requisition has been signed by Mr. Jim Day and Mr. Don Adams.

The project consists of the installation of a 14.5 kW photovoltaic system on the roof of Cottonwood High School along with the installation of a flat screen monitor in the front hallway that is connected to a real-time output monitoring system providing an educational kiosk regarding solar power.

The Common Core State Standards Initiative (CCSSI) includes a demanding set of elementary mathematics standards that are clear, understandable and consistent. They include rigorous content and application of knowledge through high-order thinking skills. The CCSS have been adopted by Utah. Because of the depth and complexity of these core standards, our elementary teachers need continued assistance in implementing them in their classrooms. We are committed to providing our Granite School District students, teachers, and parents with appropriate materials to enhance learning and increase student achievement in the mathematics area.

The 2011 adoption is up for renewal. A pricing structure has been negotiated to renew Houghton Mifflin's Go Math program. The 2015 Go Math edition is more rigorous with enhanced technology components to support teacher instruction and student learning.

We are leveraging end-of-fiscal-year goals of the publisher and a unique bundling of online 2015 materials and resources to provide much needed instructional support for our elementary students and teachers as they implement a rigorous, complex set of mathematics core standards district wide. The cost of this six year package for all of our elementary schools is \$2,349,256.00.
