The Maintenance Department requested bidding to establish a contract for asphalt crack seal, seal coat, mastic gap fill and parking lot and playground painting work across the district on an as needed basis. This contract would be for small jobs of less than \$50,000 each, however, the annual cumulative contract total may exceed \$50,000. Large jobs, of more than \$50,000, will be bid out on an individual basis and will not be awarded under this contract.

An Invitation For Bid, including specifications, was posted on the Utah Public Procurement Place. Qualifying bid results are as follows, which show total bid amounts for an estimated amount of work:

The Purchasing Department received a request from Dr. Noelle Converse and Mr. Rick Anthony to conduct a request for proposals (RFP) process to source a Computer Adaptive Personalized Early Learning Program for K-2 Students during the summer of 2021.

The RFP was issued to perspective companies and we received two proposals for consideration. Unfortunately, only one of the two proposals met the mandatory minimum requirements. The evaluation committee did score the remaining proposal against the requirement in the RFP. Their scoring follows:

Waterford Research Institute	99

The proposed Waterford Research Institute program has been selected as the supplemental summer intervention component to complement Granite School District's 4-week summer school intervention for K-2 students. The program's strong alignment to the Utah Core literacy, math and social emotional learning competency standards, ease of use and engagement features for students and parents, and personalized training and coaching components make it an ideal solution to help address the learning loss of our early learners.

June through August, all K-2 students enrolled in the summer program will participate in daily online personalized learning experiences in literacy, math and science that are not only highly engaging but also closely aligned with the literacy and math goals of the district. Parents will benefit from regular and ongoing support from live Waterford tutors through regularly scheduled check-ins on the progress of the students.

We respectfully request permission to contract with the Waterford Research Institute. The program cost per student is \$400.00. The district has identified 3,000 students who qualify for

this service. The total contract value is \$1,200,000. The contract term will be May 24, 2021 through August 31, 2021. Funds for this purchase are to come from the Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief Fund II.

The Purchasing Department received a request from Dr. Joan Giroux-Bramble and Mr. Rick Anthony to conduct a request for proposals (RFP) process to source a student formative assessment and benchmark software for all district students.

The RFP was issued to perspective companies and we received eight proposals for consideration. The evaluation committee consisted of district and school administrators, district assessment specialists, and teachers. Three of the eight proposals were disqualified for failing to meet minimum requirements leaving five for full evaluation. The following is the ranking of the proposals:

We respectfully request permission to contract with Illuminate Education for their SchoolCity software. The annual cost of the program is \$4.00 per student. Using an estimated student enrollment of 61,000 the first-year contract cost would be \$244,000 with an additional \$3,000.00 for training. No implementation services or associate costs are necessary because SchoolCity is the product currently under contract with the district. Each subsequent year under the contract the cost would be approximately \$252,000.00 depending on exact enrollment figures. The contract term will be three years with two one-year renewal options. Funds for this purchase are to come from the Research and Assessment Operations and Maintenance funds.
