

Article III.A. Philosophy

- A. The Board of Education has the responsibility of representing the state and the people of the community and accepts the responsibility for the democratic management of the public schools of the district.

- B. The Board appoints the superintendent of schools as its executive officer. The superintendent represents the Board of Education. The superintendent advises the Board of Education on policies required by law and on policies which are appropriate and are educationally sound. The superintendent is also cognizant of programs desired by the people of the district for the best education of their children, and is responsible to the Board of Education for the implementation of Board policies. The superintendent is expected to be a person who possesses desirable personal qualities, including exemplary moral principals, communication skills, courage, integrity and emotional stability.
